Our first thoughts as a country must be how we can support those families and their loved ones. We urge the government to immediately activate their support mechanisms and ensure they get all the care they need both now and in the future.

We also know from experience that how we respond as a country matters.

Terrorists seek to divide our communities.

They want us to spread their hatred, to live in fear, and to undermine our collective way of life. Their worst nightmare is that instead of dividing us these attacks pull us closer together.

That's particularly important because of the nature of this attack. It wasn't just an attack on individuals; it was an attack designed to spread fear across the Jewish community. Our response must be to reach out to that community and tell them that they are us - and we are them. We will not be divided from each other by those spreading hatred.

We cannot undo what has happened - but we can choose how we respond as a country.
